



GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION MPS 2026

KEY INFORMATION:

- The author submitting the contribution online will be responsible for informing the co-authors about the status of the abstract;
- Abstract MUST be submitted through the dedicated platform, other form of submission won't be accepted;
- Add 5 keywords in order to allow to select better the groups;
- The name of the author who will submit the contribution must be underlined;
- Accepted formats: PDF format
- All abstracts must be submitted in English
- Length: Title (300 characters including spaces);
- The maximum number of characters (including spaces) for the text of the abstract (title, authors and affiliations excluded) is 3000 characters per abstract.
- Font and dimension: Arial, 14 for Title and Section, 12 for text

NOTE: At the time of the abstract acceptance as a poster, the first author must be registered for the Symposium. If they are unable to attend, they should appoint another author as the first author and send the final PDF with the revised author list.

The abstract should be structured as follows:

- Title
- Authors - Surname and Name initial and affiliation reference of the first author + any co-authors e.g. Bon M.1
- Affiliations
- Introduction/Background - briefly introduce the topic and the state of art of it
- Aim of the study/Objectives - Clearly state the aim and hypothesis of your study
- Materials and Methods - approach, procedures and steps followed and used during the study
- Result - present the main findings, including data. Do not include subjective statements or detailed statistical analyses
- Conclusion/Discussion - Summarize the overall findings, their significance, and implications

The abstract may include:

- Up to 1 table
- Up to 1 figure
- Do not include any references to your research center or institution within the abstract text

NOTE: insert name, surname, email, postal address and telephone number of the abstract presenter (the person designated to present the scientific work during the conference days if different from the person who submits the abstract) - Abstracts open to all participants



EVALUATION

Abstracts will be reviewed by evaluators appointed by the Scientific Committee, based on established and validated criteria:

- **Originality**
- **Clarity**
- **Rationale**
- **Objectives**
- **Endpoint measures**
- **Statistics**
- **Results**
- **Relevance**

CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Authors must disclose all potential conflicts of interest, including financial agreements or consulting relationships with any organization involved in the research. Even the absence of conflicts of interest must be explicitly stated. At the time of submission, it must be indicated whether the material has been previously presented or published in other journals prior to the congress.

Submitted work must be original and unpublished.

Abstracts presented at other conferences/meetings are permitted.

"Unpublished" refers to publications in scientific journals or journals. In that case, submissions are NOT permitted.

RESPONSIBILITIES

The presenting author is responsible for the accuracy of the submitted abstract, confirming that the first author and co-authors agree with its content.

The authors are solely responsible for the information contained in their work, including the accuracy of citations. The Scientific Committee assumes no responsibility for the content of the submissions.

NOTE: patient data must be anonymized to ensure privacy. All necessary approvals, including informed consent, must be obtained and clearly stated within the abstract.

PRIZES AND WINNERS

The best abstracts will be selected for oral presentation in the Symposium agenda.

During the award ceremony the presentations and posters deemed worthy by the committee during the symposium will be rewarded.

All details regarding the presentation schedule (day, time, session) will be included in the Acceptance Letter for the abstract.
